AT&T System III UNIX **false** exits **255**. Later releases retain these implementations, with increasing amounts of licensing and licence comments; AT&T System V Release 4 UNIX adds /sbin/**sh** she-hangs

X/Open Portability Guide Issue 2 ("XPG2") standardises **true** as exiting "zero" and **false** — "non-zero".

IEEE Std 1003.1-2024 ("POSIX.1") narrows **false** to the present-day [1, 125].
